
This risk assessment is used to assess potential risks within the school's activities and where necessary identify control measures to remove or reduce the identified risk.

Risk Level summary has been put together using 5x5 Matrix (IOSH) of Likelihood against Consequence. It is recognised that control measures can impact the likelihood there is little which can be undertaken to reduce the consequence. Generally, risks will be reduced 'so far as reasonably practicable'.



The product of consequence and likelihood provide an action level as shown in the table below.

17-25	Unacceptable	Stop activity and make immediate improvements
10-16	Tolerable	Look to improve within specified timescale
5-9	Adequate	Look to improve at next review
1-4	Acceptable	No further action but ensure control measures are maintained

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This Risk Assessment has been developed in consultation with members of staff and underpins the requirements of the Governments guidance – "Performing arts – Working safely during coronavirus (COVID - 19) and its key areas. For the purposes of this Risk Assessment we will only be considering rehearsals.
